Student Aid




- Student Aid is designed to supplement other forms of resources that a student may have.
- The Need Assessment Formula determines if a student is eligible for funding.
- Student Aid funding may not be enough!



How to Apply





- 3. Create an Account
- 4. Complete the online application
- 5. Print required forms, complete and submit



Need Assessment Process



Costs - Resources = Need

Costs Resources Tuition/Fees \$1,921 Pre-Study Income \$864 Parental Contribution Food/Shelter \$ 3,536 \$ 204 **Books** \$ 550 Study Period Income \$ 631 Computers \$ 250 **RESPs/Scholarships** \$0 Transportation \$ 285 Savings \$0 **Total Cost \$6,542** Other \$0 Total Resources \$ 1,699

\$6,542 - \$1,699 = \$4843

Loans and grants may <u>not</u> cover your need!



Student Aid Funding



Canada Student Loan Program Portion

- Can be a combination of loan and grants
- Up to \$210/week loan plus grants if eligible

NL Student Loan Program Portion

- Can be a combination of grants and loans
- Up to \$100 in grants and \$40 in loan per week
- Provincial loans are always interest free

Maximum amounts available!



Canada Student Grants (CSG)



Up to maximum of \$3000/year (or about \$88/week)

CSG – Students with Dependents

Up to a maximum of \$2400 per child under the age of 12


Note: For eligible students enrolled in **programs 60 weeks or longer** and is based on family income

Definition



Permanent Disability

- "A functional limitation
- caused by a physical or mental impairment
- that restricts the ability of a person to perform the daily activities necessary to participate in studies at a post-secondary level or in the labor force
- is expected to remain with the person for the person's expected life."









Barrier

"anything that prevents a person with a disability from fully participating in postsecondary education because of his/her disability, including a physical barrier, an information or communication barrier, a technological barrier, a policy or a practice; ("obstacle")"

Student with Permanent Disabilities



Students with a permanent disability are:


- □ May register in 40% or more of a full course load
- ☐ Have a lifetime limit of borrowing for up to 520 weeks
- □ Eligible for the additional federal grants:
 - \$2000 Canada Student Grant PD
 - \$20,000 Canada Student Grant Services and Equipment

Student Aid Application Process



Canada Student Grant for Students with Permanent Disabilities



Eligibility Criteria:

- Applied and qualified for a Canada Student Loan (CSL) with assessed need of at least \$1
- Attend a designated post-secondary educational institution on a part-time or full-time basis
- Submit a completed Verification of Eligibility Form

If approved, student's are eligible for \$2,000 per academic year.



Verification of Eligibility Form



This form:

- Must confirm that the disability is permanent
- Must include barriers to post-secondary education or the labour market
- Must be completed by a medical or educational assessor (unless learning disability <u>only</u>)
- Is generally only required once during post-secondary studies



Grant for Service and Equipment for Students with Permanent Disabilities



To receive this grant, a student must:

- □ be approved using the Verification of Eligibility Form
- complete an <u>Application for Grant for Services and</u>
 <u>Equipment</u> to be completed and signed by an official from the educational institution
- provide a detailed cost estimate
- provide banking information(Direct Deposit Form stamped by bank/Void Cheque)

If approved - eligible for up to \$20,000 per academic year.



Service and Equipment Eligible Education-Related Costs



Services

- Note taker
- Tutor
- Reader
- Interpreter (oral; sign)
- Attendant care required for studies
- Specialized transportation (to and from education institution only)
- 75% of the cost of a learning disability assessment, up to a maximum of \$1,700

Equipment

- Recording equipment
- Alternate Formats
- Computer/Software
- Tablet
- CCTVs
- Digital Voice Recorder
- Braille Products
- FM Systems



Service and Equipment Eligible Education-Related Costs



- Repair, Replacement & Warranty
- Appropriateness/Timeliness





Service and Equipment Ineligible Costs



The CSG-SE will NOT cover:

- Capital costs
- Hearing aids
- TTY phones
- Furniture
- Wheelchairs
- Internet access









The Applicant's Next Step



 Receipts must be submitted indicating the funds issued were used for their intended purposes.





Things to Remember



- □ Set up your Student Aid account online
- Complete and submit the Student Aid application
- □ Submit the **Verification of Eligibility Form**
- If required, submit the Application for Services and Equipment
- ☐ If requesting funding for services and equipment, submit quotes for each type of service/equipment

NOTE: A new Student Aid application is required each academic year.
